Working Modalities for the Preparatory Meeting

The Preparatory Meeting will be convened by the co-organizers of the International Conference of the Red Cross and Red Crescent (IFRC and ICRC), with the aim of providing an opportunity to exchange views on the draft zero resolutions proposed for the 33rd International Conference. This meeting will allow all members of the International Conference to come together and identify areas of broad agreement or contention. It will not be a negotiation of the text of the proposed draft zero resolutions. The meeting will be co-chaired by senior leaders of the ICRC and IFRC.

The meeting will be designed to enable a productive exchange of views and to have a dialogue about the proposed resolutions.

The discussions held at this meeting will guide the Conference organizers to further the preparatory and consultation process on the draft zero resolutions, with a view to finalizing the drafts that will be shared with the official mailing for the Conference on October 25, 2019.

The Co-Chairs of the Preparatory Meeting will produce a brief written summary of the issues identified, highlighting areas of broad agreement and remaining areas which require further attention. Efforts will be undertaken to further discuss and ideally overcome areas of contention during the ensuing months, and before the official draft resolutions are produced. The written

summary will be informal and will not purport to be an exhaustive outline of the discussions, and will not contain attribution to individual members.

This meeting is open to all International Conference Members, which includes National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the High Contracting Parties to the Geneva Conventions, the IFRC and the ICRC. There will be a four-week period following the meeting, during which Conference members will still have the opportunity to send written comments on the zero draft resolutions. The deadline for these comments is the 31st July 2019.
