Protecting people from the humanitarian impacts of extreme climate and weather events: Working together to strengthen anticipatory action


#### **RESOLUTION 6**

## 152 pledges (as of 28 February 2025)

102 specific pledges and 50 open pledges were signed, highlighting the informal individual/joint/collective commitments of members and observers on numerous conference themes and topics




#### 27 side events

hosted by conference members/observers took place outside the official proceedings on topics related to the conference themes, offering an informal space for discussion and exchange among participants



#### 188 statements

were delivered during the plenary session "For the record: Voices from the Conference", representing the variety of participants' views on the conference themes, including 16 statements from groups of members and 3 State/National Society joint statements



#### 38 exhibitions

showcased a variety of initiatives/projects in different settings, including immersive experiences, and provided an interactive space for networking and learning



#### 3 Commissions and 12 spotlight sessions

Commission I: Building a global culture of respect for international humanitarian law (IHL)

Commission II: Standing by our Fundamental Principles in responding to humanitarian needs and risks

Commission III: Enabling sustainable, locally led action

4 spotlight sessions per commission covering the topics of disability inclusion, war in cities, climate change, migration, protection risks and digitalization, volunteering, the auxiliary role, financing, protection of the natural environment in armed conflicts, autonomous weapon systems, respect for neutral, impartial and independent humanitarian action, and locally led community health action and front-line preparedness,
